

Exodus 2 Lesson 3

## Day 1 | Read Exodus 2:1-10, Matthew 1:20-25, 2:13-15, and 2:19-23. Principle: God's plan for his people cannot be stopped. 1. Why did God directly intervene in the lives of Moses and Jesus when they were babies? 2. How has God protected you, especially when you were younger, and for what reason(s) or purpose do you think He chose to protect you? Day 2 | Read Exodus 2:11-15, 1 Samuel 13:8-14, Romans 12:19, and Proverbs 14:12. Principle: Acting outside of God's timing can cause suffering and broken relationships. 1. Knowing that God is going to kill many Egyptians to rescue His people (see Exodus 14:26-28), why do you think God did not bless Moses when he killed the Egyptian? 2. How have you suffered because you acted outside of God's timing or his leading? Day 3 | Read Exodus 2:16-22, Leviticus 19:34, Hebrews 13:1-2, and 1 Peter 4:9. Principle: God provides for his people through the generosity of those whom He has blessed. 1. What does this story reveal about how God provides for His people when they are experiencing difficult situations? 2. Why should you be generous with Christians in need and what causes you to decide to help? Day 4 | Read Exodus 2:23-25, Genesis 15:13-14, 2 Samuel 7:8-16, and Luke 22:20. Principle: God can always be trusted to keeps his covenant promises. 1. Why is the keeping of these covenants so critical to the faith of Christians?

2. What is at least one promise of God that you have learned that has helped you amidst suffering?
