

## Day 1 | Read Exodus 6:28-7:7, Isaiah 41:10, 1 Corinthians 1:26-27, 2 Corinthians 12:9, and Hebrews 13:20-21

Principle: God responds to our fear of inadequacy by revealing that He is the one at work in us.

- 1. When Moses asks God why Pharoah would listen to him, what is at the heart of God's response?
- 2. How often do you hear a voice telling you that you are inadequate? Through these verses, how is God telling you to deal with that voice in your head?

## Day 2 | Read Exodus 7:1-5, John 13:21-30, Romans 11:25-32, and 2 Thessalonians 2:9-12

Principle: God's revelation of His power will cause many hearts to harden and other hearts to repent.

- 1. How can a man possess the freedom to repent if God is hardening his heart?
- 2. How does God use hard hearts to bring about the salvation of His people?
- 3. If preaching the gospel leads to both hard hearts *and* repentant hearts, how should we measure our success as Christians when we share our testimony of faith with unbelievers?

## Day 3 Read Exodus 7:8-13, Exodus 20:1-2, Genesis 3:1, Genesis 3:15, Ephesians 6:12, and Revelation 12:7-9

Principle: God is actively engaged in a spiritual battle with the devil who is working to pull mankind away from Him.

- 1. How does the Bible first introduce the devil and why do you think God chose to show his power over the snake first before any of the devil's other described forms?
- 2. In what ways has the devil manifested himself in your life and how have you dealt with him?

## Day 4 | Read Exodus 7:14-24, Daniel 4:25, Luke 13:4-5, and Philippians 2:9-11

Principle: God will use pain and suffering to help people see the futility in worshipping anything other than Him.

- 1. Why do you think God eliminated every possible source of life from the Nile river? What might be one critical source of life in our country that God could disrupt to demonstrate his power?
- 2. What do you most depend on for security and/or your identity that God sees as a replacement for Him in your heart?
