

Day 1 | Read 1 Timothy 6:17, Proverbs 23:4, Lamentations 3:24, Matthew 6:24, Luke 12:33, and 1 Peter 1:3

Principle: Christians who have wealth must be careful to put their trust and hope in God instead of their money.

1. Why did Paul tell Timothy to instruct wealthy Christians to trust in God instead of their wealth?
2. How has money or a lack of money impacted your heart and your trust in God?

Day 2 | Read 1 Timothy 6:18, Deuteronomy 15:10, Proverbs 19:17, Matthew 25:34-36, and Philippians 2:4

Principle: Christians who have wealth should be generous with their money and use more of their time to do good works.

1. What happens to wealthy Christians when they are generous with their time and money?

Day 3 | Read 1 Timothy 6:19, Proverbs 3:9-10, and Matthew 6:19-20

Principle: Christians can create treasure in heaven and build a foundation for their eternal life.

1. How does generosity build a foundation for eternal life?
2. What change in your investments do you need to make to start building a stronger eternal foundation?

Day 4 | Read 1 Timothy 6:20-21, Psalm 119:11, Proverbs 3:5-8, 2 Corinthians 10:5, Colossians 2:8, 2 Timothy 1:13-14, and 1 Peter 5:8-9

Principle: As Christians, we must guard our faith in Jesus and turn away from everything that threatens it.

1. What does Paul describe as “threats” to Timothy’s faith, and how do you think he expects Timothy to guard what was entrusted to him?
2. What do you personally do to guard your heart and in what ways are you allowing the world access to your heart?
