



Day 1 | Read Exodus 3:18-20, 4:1-9, Psalm 19:1-2, John 20:30-31, 2 Cor. 5:17, Ephesians 1:13-14, Colossians 1:15, and 2 Timothy 3:16.

Principle: God welcomes our doubts and provides all the evidence needed to prove He is God.

- 1. Why did God still give Moses three miraculous signs even though Moses ignored God's message that the elders would listen to Him?
- 2. How has God proven to you that Jesus is God, and that God and the Son are one?

Day 2 | Read Exodus 4:10-17, Jonah 1:2-4 & 1:17, Judges 6:15-40, Jeremiah 1:6-9, and 1 Kings 19:4-15.

Principle: God equips His people to do his work after He calls them, even when they object to His calling.

- 1. How does God's response to Moses explain His view of our handicaps and shortcomings when He calls us to serve?
- 2. Recognizing Moses had objected five times to God's command to "go", why do you think God burned with anger specifically at this final objection of Moses?
- 3. What does this scripture teach about managing our fears when God leads us into difficult seasons of life?

Day 3 Read Exodus 4:18-23, Genesis 11:5-7, Daniel 4:13-18, Acts 9:1-6, and Romans 9:14-18.

Principle: God's sovereign plan is controlled by His power and purpose and is not changed by man's response.

- 1. What do you learn about God from all of these scriptural references?
- 2. How have you seen God override the direction of your life, and for what purpose do you think He did this?

Day 4 | Read Exodus 4:24-31, Genesis 17:9-14, 1 Samuel 15:22, Matthew 26:39, John 14:15, and Hebrews 5:8-9.

Principle: When we truly believe in God, our natural response is to obey and worship Him.

- 1. Why do you think circumcision of Moses' son was so important to God in this moment?
- 2. Why is your trust of God and obedience to Him a critical part of being a follower of Jesus?
